PROGRAM INFORMATION

The online dietetics master's degree is open to Registered Dietitian Nutritionists (RDNs). This program allows you to customize the curriculum to meet your professional needs.

- how to evaluate and apply new research concepts and theories to advance the profession of dietetics
- about public policy and current systems of health care delivery
- how to contribute to evidence-based practice

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's degree with a 3.0 minimum GPA in the final two years or approximately the last 60 credit hours
- Credentialed as a registered dietitian by the Commission on Dietetic Registration of the American Dietetic Association, or must be registration-eligible OR
- If you do not hold the RDN credential, you must provide a verification statement issued by a program accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND).
